5. Read Mark 3:1-6, Luke 13:10-17, and Like 14:1-6. In a single sentence, what is the central message of these three passages?
6. On a scale from 0-10, how "Pharisaical" are you? What is the most important thing you can do to become less like the Pharisees and more like Jesus?
