## QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION & DISCUSSION

1. Read Mark 6:7-13. Which sentence in this paragraph is most challenging to you

	personally? Why?
2.	Do you believe you have the same measure of authority over demons that the apostles had? (Luke 10:17-19 and Colossians 2:9-10 may help you to answer this.) What do you think we should do and should not do when we confront evil spirits?
3.	To what extent are you restricted in your service to the Lord by your preoccupation with financial security? What would you do differently if you were to fully obey Matthew 6:31-34 and Hebrews 13:5?
4.	In your opinion, is it ever right to stop sharing the gospel with an unresponsive person? How do you balance Mark 6:11 with 2 Peter 3:9? Who do these passages make you think of?
5.	Skim through the following passages: Mark 1:15; 6:12; Luke 24:47; Acts 2:38; 11:18; 17:30; 20:21. Why do you think some passages on the gospel stress the need for repentance and others don't? When is it necessary to include a call to repentance in the gospel? When is it unnecessary?
6.	How do you believe Mark 6:13 applies to 21 <sup>st</sup> century ambassadors of Christ?
